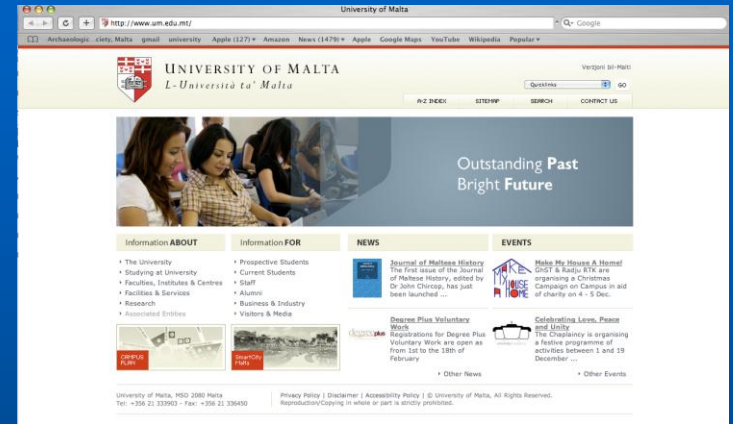
The University Today

- 3305 new students started around 787 courses
- Over 2394 students taking up undergraduate courses
- Over 911 students reading for postgraduate degrees
- 594 international students hailing from 84 different countries.
- Total student body for academic year 2012-2013 is in excess of 11,000
- Some 4630 Males and 6420 Females
